JOB SUMMARY:

In accordance with the Vision, Purpose, and Values, and strategic direction of the Vancouver Island Health Authority (Island Health) patient and staff safety is a priority and a responsibility shared by everyone; as such, the requirement to continuously improve quality and safety is inherent in all aspects of this position.

Working as a member of a multidisciplinary health care team, the Surgical Care Nurse functions as an experienced self-directed surgical care nurse by assessing, planning, providing, and evaluating nursing care for assigned patients.

TYPICAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Develops and implements a Nursing Care Plan complementary to multi-disciplinary plans of care, evaluating care and outcomes and modifying the Care Plan as appropriate by:
 - Assessing the health status of the patient and promoting independence in a systematic and ongoing manner;
 - Developing, evaluating, modifying and implementing written nursing care based on assessed needs and prescribed medical regime;
 - Evaluating in an ongoing manner, the extent to which the patient's health care needs are being met;
 - Providing health teaching to the patient and family/caregivers;
 - Initiating discharge planning in conjunction with the patient, family/caregivers, health care team members and community resources;
 - Acting as patient advocate to protect and promote patient autonomy, respect, privacy, dignity and access to information; and
 - Promoting good public relations and community awareness by effectively communicating with patients, families and visitors.
- 2. Functions as a member of the nursing team by:
 - Assigning specific tasks to designated staff, such as Licensed Practical Nurses, and directing work performed;
 - Collegially sharing nursing care skills, demonstrating and providing guidance; and

- Participating in Continuous Quality Improvement by conducting audits, completing appropriate reports, providing feedback and following up on risk factors and making recommendations for improvement to applicable policies, objectives and standards.
- 3. Functions as a member of the multidisciplinary health care team by:
 - Collaborating with other members of the team in the planning and provision of patient care;
 - Co-ordinating nursing care with other aspects of heath care;
 - Promotes good interdepartmental relations by effectively communicating with community, hospital and medical staff, both verbally and in writing;
 - Ensuring a safe environment for patients and staff by observing universal precautions and infection control
 procedures, removing obvious hazards, reporting faulty equipment, and adhering to and enforcing rules regarding
 safety; and
 - Participating in the development of team, department and/or program statement of mission, philosophy, policies, objectives and standards.
- 4. Fulfils the responsibilities of and performs basic and critical care specialised nursing skills as an experienced self-directed surgical/ambulatory care nurse in accordance with hospital policies, procedures and standards, including delegated medical functions, giving prescribed medications, therapeutic treatments and following through on physician's orders.
- 5. Documents care given and observations made, reporting significant changes in patient condition appropriately.
- 6. Demonstrates personal initiative in maintaining professional nursing knowledge and skills by participating in relevant educational activities as required by the employer.
- 7. Performs other related duties as assigned

Registration with BC College of Nurses and Midwives as a practicing RN registrant; and

Post-basic education in surgical/ambulatory care nursing on a unit specific basis; or

An equivalent combination of education and training.

Up to two (2) years recent, related experience on a unit specific basis.
